


The College of Dentistry in Brief



The College of Dentistry was established in the academic year 1982 to be another basic building block to be added to the rest of the Colleges at the University of Mosul in order to become an important aspect of science and community service. The College occupied two sites within the university campus, where the first site was the building that the College of Agriculture and Forestry currently occupies near the Deanship of the College of Arts and then it moved to its current location near one of the university's entrances facing the Al-Hadba sub - district neighborhood in the year 2008. The main goal for the establishment of the college of dentistry in was in order to strengthen the university's role in providing dental community service, through accessing various sections and fields in training, consulting, education, continuous modernization, and others, which ultimately led to the development of the quality of service provided to the community. The college adopts an annual academic system of five academic years delivered in English language. The curriculum has been updated as from the academic year 2019 - 2020 (from first academic year up to the fifth academic level) to meet with global teaching standards. At completion of study with success, the student is awarded a bachelor's degree (B.D.S) in dental science. The number of graduates since its college establishment and the end of academic year (2020-2021) reached a total of (2431) graduates of both genders. In addition to the undergraduate program provided, the college also awards higher degrees (PhD, MSc, and HD) for different dental specialties and basic dental sciences. As for the current infrastructure layout of the college, it consists of two buildings, the deanship of the college, which includes all the administrative and scientific divisions in the college and the department of basic dental sciences department. The second building being the dental teaching hospital with its four scientific clinical departments, Department of oral and maxillofacial surgery (largest) , Department of Prosthodontics, Department of Pediatrics, Orthodontics and Preventive Dentistry and the Department of Conservative dentistry, all delivering community dental services by students under staff supervision.
