




Sustainable Development

Development, 1987








Millennium Development Goals 2000 - 2015






































People - to end poverty and hunger.....and to ensure that all human beings can fulfil their potential in dignity and equality and in a healthy environment

- Goal 1. End poverty in all its forms everywhere
- Goal 2. End hunger, achieve food security and improved nutrition and promote sustainable agriculture
- Goal 3. Ensure healthy lives and promote well-being for all at all ages
- Goal 4. Ensure inclusive and equitable quality education and promote lifelong learning opportunities for all
- Goal 5. Achieve gender equality and empower all women and girls
- Goal 6. Ensure availability and sustainable management of water and sanitation for all



Prosperity - to ensure that all human beings can enjoy prosperous and fulfilling lives and that economic, social and technological progress occurs in harmony with nature.

- Goal 7. Ensure access to affordable, reliable, sustainable and modern energy for all
- Goal 8. Promote sustained, inclusive and sustainable economic growth, full and productive employment and decent work for all
- Goal 9. Build resilient infrastructure, promote inclusive and sustainable industrialization and foster innovation
- Goal 10. Reduce inequality within and among countries
- Goal 11. Make cities and human settlements inclusive, safe, resilient and sustainable





Planet - to protect the planet from degradation..... sustainably managing its natural resources and taking urgent action on climate change, so that it can support the needs of the present and future generations

- Goal 12. Ensure sustainable consumption and production patterns
- Goal 13. Take urgent action to combat climate change and its impacts
- Goal 14. Conserve and sustainably use the oceans, seas and marine resources for sustainable development
- Goal 15. Protect, restore and promote sustainable use of terrestrial ecosystems, sustainably manage forests, combat desertification, and halt and reverse land degradation and halt biodiversity loss





Peace - to foster peaceful, just and inclusive societies free from fear and violence. *There can be no sustainable* development without peace and no peace without sustainable development.

 Goal 16. Promote peaceful and inclusive societies for sustainable development, provide access to justice for all and build effective, accountable and inclusive institutions at all levels

Partnerships - to mobilize the means required to implement agenda through a revitalised global partnership for sustainable development.....

 Goal 17. Strengthen the means of implementation and revitalize the global partnership for sustainable development

Renewed focus on inclusion, equity and gender equality

Quality

- Renewed focus on effective acquisition of foundational skills
- New focus on relevance of learning for decent jobs
- New focus on relevance of learning for social and civic life

Health and Well-being

Target 3.7: By 2030, ensure universal access to sexual and reproductive health -care services, including for family planning, information and education, and the integration of reproductive health into national strategies and programmes



Gender Equality

Global Indicator: Number of countries with laws and regulations that guarantee women aged 15-49 years access to sexual and reproductive health care, information and education



Decent Work and Economic Growth

Target 8.6: By 2020 substantially reduce the proportion of youth not in employment, education or training



Responsible Consumption & Production

Target 12.8: By 2030 ensure that people everywhere have the relevant information and awareness for sustainable development and lifestyles in harmony with nature



Climate Change Mitigation

Target 13.3: Improve education, awareness raising and human and institutional capacity on climate change mitigation, adaptation, impact reduction, and early warning
