What is an Essay?

 An essay is a short piece of writing focused on a particular subject. It expresses the writer's point of view, supported by evidence, and is structured around a central argument or thesis. Essays are used to inform, persuade, explain, or entertain.

Importance of Essay Writing in Academia

- Demonstrates understanding of a topic
- Develops critical thinking and analytical skills
- -Improves written communication
- -Essential for exams, assignments, and research

Types of Essays

- Descriptive: Describes a person, place, or event
- -Narrative: Tells a story or personal experience
- -Expository: Explains a concept or topic
- -Argumentative: Presents arguments on an issue

Structure of a Basic Essay

- Introduction: Presents the topic and thesis
- Body Paragraphs: Develop the argument with evidence
- -Conclusion: Summarizes and restates the thesis

The Essay Triangle

- Use a funnel approach:
- Introduction: Broad to narrow focus
- Body: Focused argument with supporting evidence
- -Conclusion: Summarize and broaden implications

Features of a Good Essay

- -Clear central argument (thesis)
- Logical organization
- -Well-developed paragraphs
- -Evidence-based
- -Academic tone and citation

Common Mistakes in Essay Writing

- -Unclear thesis
- Poor transitions
- Over-generalizations
- Grammar and punctuation errors
- -Plagiarism or improper citation
