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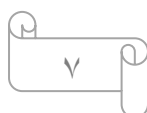
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Introduction

This is the second book that I prepared as a guide for the History Department after completing the first guide for postgraduate studies ⁽¹⁾. And I say... Praise be to God who helped me to complete this guide that came to illuminate the path and catch up, as it is a history of the History Department. I tried my best to trace his academic career since 60 years of his life, which he spent in the department in diligence, activity, and tireless work during which twenty presidents assumed the presidency, some of whom served more than once, and others did not complete the term due to circumstances of their own. But everyone was dedicated to their work and accomplished their duties. This guide came to provide a historical overview of the founding of the History Department and clarify its vision, goals, and scientific mission. It also dealt with the administrative structure of the department in terms of the administrative body, the teaching staff, and the scientific committees that the department formed to follow up on the department's various activities, the most important of which is the scientific process. Since study in the department has not stopped since its founding until now, despite the difficult circumstances that have afflicted the city in general and the University of Mosul in particular, the History Department has continued its work and achievements without stopping to confirm its scientific solidity on the homeland.

This guide also tried to be a guide for students in their journey by clarifying the mechanism for applying for preliminary and postgraduate studies, and I did not fail to review the study materials, graduation research, and a list of the names of the department heads since its founding in 1966, along with their rapporteurs....

The guide was divided into fourteenth topics, in which it dealt with: a historical overview of the Department of History since its founding in 1966, then the administrative body of the department consisting of the head of the department, the rapporteur, the deputy head of the department, and the secretariat. Then I discussed the faculty of the department and its scientific committees, the most important of which are: the examination committee .Then I reviewed the study materials for undergraduate and graduate students, then how to register in the department, and I also addressed the subject of graduation research, which is the primary goal of study in the department to prepare solid academic researchers in historical scientific research. Then I addressed the beginnings of the History Department since its founding until the year 2025, and the most important achievements that have been achieved in the department, and then I discussed the department's future plans and what it seeks to achieve. At the conclusion of the guide, it includes three appendices that include department heads, department rapporteurs, and a schedule of the initial study.

First: a historical overview of the department:

He founded the Department of History in 1966, and it is considered one of the first scientific departments in the College of Arts. The College of Arts was called: The Commission for Humanistic Studies, on September 29, 1966 AD. The college was affiliated with the University of Baghdad until the end of 1967, when the University of Mosul was founded and became independent from the University of Baghdad, and in 1971 it became known as the College of Arts, The Department of History was one of the four college departments from which the College of Arts was established: History, Arabic Language, European Languages, and Economics, and the Higher Institute of Accounting was attached to it. The department remained in existence after the independence of the University of Mosul in 1967. In 1975, it was closed and then reopened in September 1977 AD. It is still open for study and receives male and female students from various parts of Iraq as well as Arab countries.

The Department of History did not have a head when it was founded in 1966. The Dean of the College at the time, Dr. Abdel Moneim Rashad (1934–2008 AD), assumed the duties of heading the department due to his specialty being in history. This continued for a year, then Dr. Amer Suleiman Ibrahim (1936–2011 AD) took over the presidency of the department in 1967 AD. Then he was followed by Dr. Mufid Muhammad Nouri in 1969, then Dr. Khader Al-Duri (1938–1995 AD) in 1973, then Dr. Tawfiq Sultan Al-Yuzbeki (1932–2003 AD).

continued to head of the department professors also served as head of the department, including Dr. Ragheb Al-Bakr, Dr. Natiq Saleh (1944 – 2023 AD) wanted, Dr. Muhammad Ali Dahesh, Dr. Ismat Burhan Al-Din, Dr. Sultan Jabr Sultan, Dr. Suhaila Majeed Ahmed, and Dr. Nayef Muhammad Shabib. The department is currently headed by Professor Dr. Mahmoud Saleh Saeed since October 2024.

The structure of the History Department consists of an administrative body: the head of the department, who is assisted in managing the department by: the deputy head of the department, the rapporteur, the rapporteur of graduate studies, the department secretariat, and the department registrar. The faculty members in the History Department are divided into multiple subcommittees to accomplish tasks jointly. There is the Department Council, the Scientific Committee, the Graduate Studies Committee, the Examination Committee, the Audit Committee, and the Quality Assurance Committee, The Guidance Committee, the Media Committee, the Workshops, Seminars and Seminars Committee, and the Student Activities Committee, in addition to the temporary committees that are formed according to the needs of the department and any emerging requirements, as these committees are reconstituted annually in accordance with the requirements of the department. All faculty members in the department are involved in these committees.

- Guiding students to achieve sustainable development during their academic work.
- Providing students with historical research skills that enable them to conduct research and delve into historical issues and problems, relying on tools in their research work and utilizing modern technology such as artificial intelligence.
- Qualifying specialized research cadres to collect, organize, classify, and categorize information, facts, and events for easy study.
- Providing scientific, educational, research, and academic institutions inside and outside Iraq with diverse historical specializations.
- Preparing to participate in providing research consultations on various historical fields to contribute to the development of societal visions and the advancement of historical culture.

Second: The administrative body of the department

The administrative body of the department consisted of: The head of the department, currently headed by Professor Dr. Mahmoud Saleh Saeed,

who has been teaching in the History Department since 2005 AD and holds a doctorate from the University of Mosul, College of Arts, 2008. He is assisted in managing the department by: The rapporteur is the teacher, Dr. Ammar Manhal Muhammad, who obtained a doctorate from the University of Mosul, College of Arts in 2021, and the rapporteur of graduate studies is Assistant Professor Dr. Omar Faisal Mahmoud, PhD, University of Mosul, College of Arts, 2018 A.D, and the department registrar is Mr. Omar Dhia Othman, and the department secretariat is from Miss Istabraq Amer Dhanoun.

Third: The department's teaching staff

The faculty members in the History Department are divided into multiple subcommittees to accomplish tasks jointly. There is the Department Council, the Scientific Committee, the Graduate Studies Committee, the Examination Committee, the Audit Committee, the Quality Assurance Committee, the Guidance Committee, the Media Committee, the Workshops, Seminars and Seminars Committee, and the Student Activities Committee, in addition to the temporary committees that are formed according to the needs of the department and any emerging requirements. These committees are reconstituted annually in accordance with the requirements of the department.

The number of teachers in the History Department this year is (68) male and female teachers in various historical and archaeological specializations, and those who hold scientific titles, as the number of holders of the title of professor reached (22) professors, holders of the title of assistant professor (25), the title of teacher (16), and the title of

assistant teacher (5). They are responsible for teaching academic subjects in the department and outside it that are related to their specializations, in addition to their participation in the department, college, and university committees, especially the promotion committees in the college, the presidency, the teaching authority committees, and internal departments, and membership in the editorship of many peer-reviewed scientific journals. Among the most important duties undertaken by a faculty member in the Department of History are: teaching and exams for students, scientific research, writing, and attending meetings of the department and scientific committees charged with managing the department's affairs and activities formed by the department, the deanship, or any work related to his specialty. He also contributes to directing students and supervising their scientific, artistic, sports, and cultural activities. He carries out the duties of his direct officials and works at the college for no less than eight hours a day in accordance with the University Service Law. They also participate in scientific conferences and seminars in his field of specialization inside or outside Iraq. The quorum for a faculty member is 8 hours per week for those holding the title of professor, 10 hours per week for those holding the title of assistant professor, 12 hours per week for those holding the title of lecturer, and 14 hours per week for those holding the title of assistant lecturer . Two hours are reduced for those who have reached fifty years of age, and four hours for those who head the department or the rapporteur.



Fourth: Scientific committees in the department

The scientific committees in the department are among the most important pillars of the department in performing its scientific and administrative tasks. They are the ones who set plans, approve titles, and teach, supervise, guide, and follow up on the entire educational process in the History Department. The scientific committees in the department have been divided into permanent committees and sub-committees. As for the permanent committees, there are five committees: The Scientific Committee, the Examination Committee, the Audit Committee, the Postgraduate Studies Committee, and the Advisory Committee. The temporary committees consist of seven committees: the Quality Assurance Committee, the Media Committee, the Student Activities Committee, the Scientific Workshops Committee, the Library Committee, the Scientific Extraction Committee, and the Sports Committee.

Fifth: The examination committee

The examination committee in the department is responsible for conducting the department's examinations for both undergraduate and graduate studies. Therefore, there are two examination committees: the undergraduate studies committee and the graduate studies committee. The committee organizes the examination questions submitted to it by the lecturers with their model answers in three models and downloads the department's form on the question paper so that it becomes official, along with downloading the name of the subject and its special code. The examination committee also prepares the grade forms and uploads the grades onto them, then reviews them and uploads them to the master sheet, uploads the grades onto the cards of each student, extracts the average, and answers the questions and requests of the registration department regarding the academic history, students' grades, and other questions related to the department's students in previous years. The examination committee also prepares a form for students' special cases to determine the amount of points they need to change their status from failure to completion and from completion to

success, according to the directives of the university presidency. The examination committee is one of the most vital committees in the department, and its work is characterized by confidentiality. An internal memo was issued by the head of the department not to release any grade or document related to students except with his approval or his representative's approval, in order to ensure that grades are not leaked.

Seventh: How to register in the department?

Registration in the department is done by passing the baccalaureate stage, as the student applies to the Faculty of Arts, provided that the average is met, or through parallel education. After that, the department is chosen after being accepted into the college, and comparison is made according to the applicants, their numbers, their averages in the history subject, and the number of seats allowed. After that, they are distributed to the academic departments according to their average and desire, and then they begin working in the department according to the dates determined by the Ministry, and they are received in the department by the registration and reception committee, and their names are registered and their signatures are taken as permission to start working in the

department, and then they are met and directed by the department head, and then they are integrated into the department and the lecturers attend, and a simple reception celebration may be held for them to welcome them and direct them in the right direction.

As for postgraduate students, they are submitted to the postgraduate studies stage (master's and doctorate) through the postgraduate studies department in the college after passing the Arabic, English and computer language exams. Then a day is set for them to take the competitive exam. The Scientific Committee has approved a set of subjects that applicants will be examined on, which are five subjects in the applicant's specialization. Since last year 2023–2024, the competitive exam has been converted into an MCQ exam based on multiple choices called: Bubble Sheet, and it has proven successful in this due to the accuracy of the results. Previously, the Scientific Committee did not require specific books, but since the 2023–2024

academic year, a specific group of books has been selected, available on social networks, for easy access. After the student passes the competitive exam, he enters into a competition based on the number of seats and students, after which those qualified for study are accepted, and admission to the department usually begins on September 1 of each year. The duration of study is two years for a master's degree and three years for a doctorate degree. An initial and final extension of six months only may be applied for. The department currently offers two courses: Islamic history and modern history. The subjects of study in postgraduate studies are as follows:

Eighth: Graduation researchers

After the student reaches the fourth year of the undergraduate stage, he is required to complete a scientific subject called: graduation research, which is a research project for which a supervisor is chosen from the department's instructors. The research title is presented to the department's scientific committee for approval, and a supervisor is appointed for it who is responsible for following up on the student's work and what he has achieved in terms of collecting scientific material and writing for a full academic year. The department may decide to distribute the students after they pass the third stage in order to give the student more time to choose the topic. At the end of the academic year, scientific discussion committees are formed, consisting of several lecturers who conduct discussions for the student about the topic of his

research. The committee consists of a chairman and two members, and the student submits three copies of his research. A specific day is set for the defense, and discussions typically begin shortly before the final exams, around April. After the student passes the defense, forms are distributed to the committee to assign the appropriate grade based on the subject and the student's defense. The grade is calculated out of 100 and distributed as follows: 40% goes to the supervisor and 20% to the three examiners. Below is a table listing the names of the students, their supervisors, and the titles of the graduation theses approved by the department's academic committee for the 2025–2026 academic year.

Ninth: The top students in the department

Students in the History Department compete to obtain the first ranks in the department and even at the college level, especially after the government's decisions regarding the appointment of the first students. The department witnesses competition among students to obtain the first ranks for the purpose of appointment and also for the purpose of applying for postgraduate studies, as many undergraduate students wish to complete their scientific and academic journey by applying for postgraduate studies. The History Department provides them with the required specializations that meet their research ambitions in academic and scientific specialization, as the department contains scientific figures and academic specializations that contribute to supporting scientific research in Iraq and strengthening it in the souls of its people. The number of top students in the History Department reached (67) male and female graduates from the morning and evening studies, and some



of them had an important position in the history department, as some of them held membership in the teaching staff in the department, while two of them took over the presidency of the History Department, while some of them found another field to practice their specialization in other educational and scientific fields. The following table includes a list of the names of all the top students who achieved this status thanks to their efforts and perseverance. Tenth: The most important scientific achievements of the department

Throughout its long history, the Department of History has achieved many academic achievements, both at the department level and at the professors' level. Many professors from the department also assumed the deanship of the college. 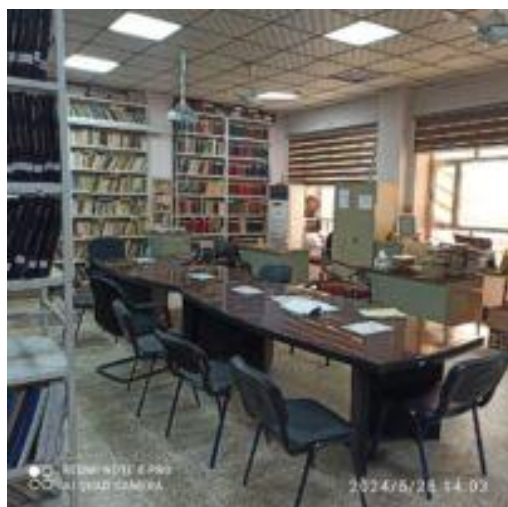

Eleventh: Department Library



In response to the growth of the department's staff and students, especially postgraduate studies, the department established in 2005 a library specializing in history after the History Department had relied on the College of Arts library, which was established in 1973. The appointment of a group of 18 master's and doctoral degree holders in

this year gave a strong impetus to the library's maturation and management, as it was managed by some of them. Among those who assumed its secretariat were Dr. Mahmoud Saleh Saeed (2005–2011 AD), Mr. Muhammad Ali Hussein (2011–2014 AD), Dr. Ammar Manhal Muhammad (2017–2020 AD), and Ms. Suham Hussein Wali (2020–2023 AD). It is currently managed by Dr. Mahmoud Mal Allah Qanbar (2023– until now). The library also received specialized libraries for some lecturers, such as the library of the late Abdul Moneim Rashad Muhammad in 2009 and part of the library of the late Jawad Ali in 2018 AD, which Dr. Mahmoud Saleh Saeed and Dr. Safwan Nazim Daoud brought from Baghdad, as well as the library of the late Ahmed Amiser Mahmoud in 2023 AD. We should not forget the donations of the department's professors and students and the gifts of the department's instructors of their writings and books, which contributed to supplying the library with rare books, in addition to the dissertations and theses that were discussed in the department over the past years, until the number of books exceeded ten thousand books. The department provides valuable services to professors and students from inside and outside the department.
