

First: A cultural visit to the Mosque of Prophet Jonah... a window into the cultural heritage of Mosul

As part of the Sociology Department's efforts to promote cultural awareness and strengthen the students' cultural identity, the department organized a cultural visit to the Mosque of the Prophet Jonah (peace be upon him), one of the most prominent historical and religious landmarks in the city of Mosul, with the participation of a number of the department's faculty members and students.

During the visit, the participants learned about the historical and cultural importance of the site, and its religious and cultural value as one of the symbols that embody the depth and diversity of Mosul's civilization, as well as learning about the stages of the mosque's reconstruction after the destruction it suffered during the years of terrorism.

The visit emphasized the importance of linking the academic aspect with the social and cultural reality, and developing students' awareness of the importance of preserving the national heritage as part of the cultural identity of society, as well as promoting the values of belonging and responsibility towards the cultural heritage of the city of Mosul.

This visit comes as part of a series of scientific and cultural activities that the Department of Sociology is keen to implement, in recognition of the university's role in building the student's character scientifically and culturally, and strengthening his connection to the history of his city and its cultural heritage.



Second: A visit to a nursing home

A humanitarian visit to a nursing home... an embodiment of the values of social responsibility

As part of the community activities organized by the Department of Sociology, and in order to promote the values of social solidarity and human responsibility, the department organized a field visit to the nursing home, with the participation of a number of the department's faculty members and students.

The visit aimed to enhance communication with the elderly, to learn about the services provided to them, to identify their social and psychological needs, as well as to bring joy and happiness to their hearts by spending time with them and listening to their life experiences, which represent an important asset of experience and knowledge.

The visit also included the presentation of a number of gifts and supplies, and an emphasis on the importance of caring for and looking after the elderly, based on the human and

religious values that urge respect and appreciation for them, and establishing a culture of volunteer work and community service among students.

This initiative comes within the Sociology Department's program aimed at promoting community partnership, linking theoretical aspects with field applications, and preparing students who possess social and human awareness and are able to contribute effectively to serving society in all its categories.



Third: A visit to the Beitna Foundation

A community visit to the Beitna Foundation... promoting a culture of humanitarian and volunteer work

As part of the community activities program of the Sociology Department, and based on its role in consolidating the values of social responsibility and volunteer work, the department organized a field visit to the Beitna Foundation, with the participation of a number of the department's faculty members and students.

The visit aimed to learn about the nature of the services and programs provided by the institution to the beneficiary groups, and to learn about its efforts in the areas of social welfare and community empowerment, as well as to highlight the importance of partnership between academic institutions and community organizations in supporting social development and promoting community cohesion.

The visit included meetings with the foundation's officials, during which views were exchanged on ways of joint cooperation, and the importance of humanitarian and voluntary initiatives in serving the community was emphasized, in addition to introducing the students to the role that community care institutions play in addressing many social and humanitarian issues.

This visit comes as part of the Sociology Department's keenness to enhance the practical aspect for students, link academic knowledge with field reality, and develop a spirit of initiative and volunteer work, which contributes to preparing cadres that possess awareness and responsibility towards the issues of society and serving it.
