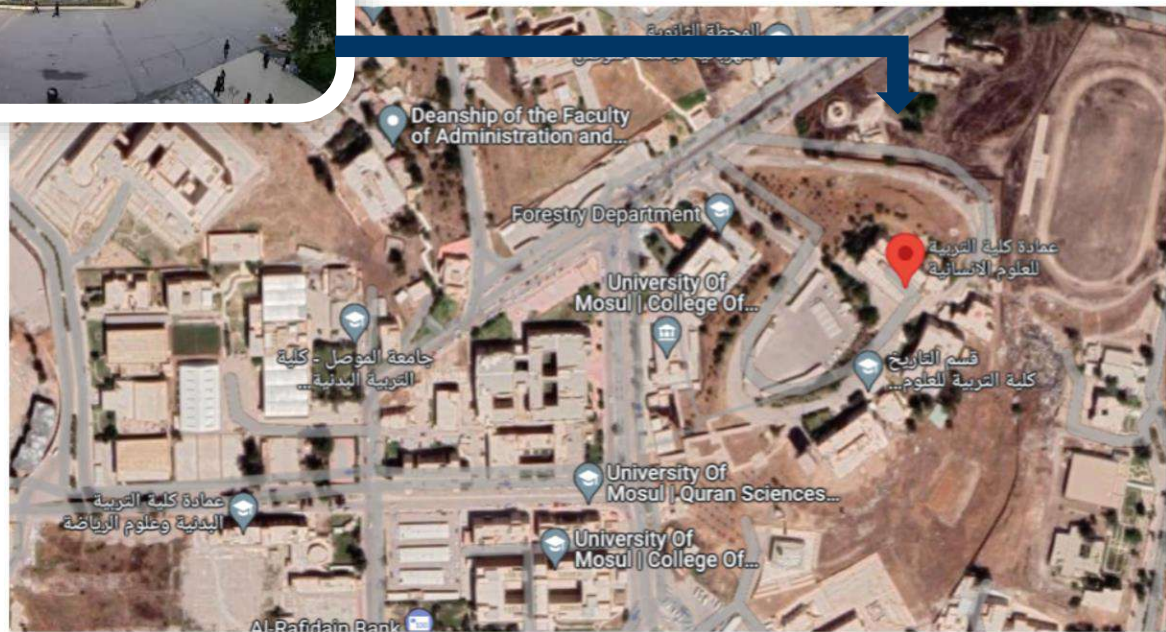

Vision, Mission and Objectives of the College

Vision

The College of Education for Humanities seeks to take a leading position in the components of developing the educational and pedagogical system for all academic levels, and to work on developing its scientific departments in cooperation with other colleges in expanding the horizon of scientific, educational and pedagogical research and achieving a pioneering role in the field of teaching, training and research in the humanities, social and linguistic sciences. In addition to consolidating the scientific level and what is consistent with scientific visions in improving the quality of the learner and advancing him in the service of society.

Mission

Working to facilitate, support and continue the educational and pedagogical process for all academic levels through cooperation with the Ministry of Education, the Ministry of Youth, the Ministry of Health, and various state ministries' institutions, as well as with instructors and researchers in similar institutions and colleges in Iraqi and Arab universities. In addition to scientific activities and consultations for various state institutions, the college is unique in its mission in the fields of preparing teachers and researchers, developing educational programs and policies.

Objectives

The Deanship of the College of Education for Humanities seeks to prepare teaching staff to support middle, secondary, and preparatory schools and institutes affiliated with the Directorates of Education in Iraq, which contribute to supporting society by graduating a batch of its students annually, and providing them throughout the study period with various educational and scientific skills, and a broad knowledge of teaching methods and modern educational techniques coupled with field training, as well as to prepare academic staff in the field of postgraduate studies, diploma, master's and doctorate in all specializations that contribute to achieving development plans and meet the requirements of the labor market, and support the educational and pedagogical process in Iraq.



The College's Sections and their Duties

First : Quality Assurance and University Performance Section

1. The Quality Assurance and University Performance Division consists of four units: University Performance Unit, Quality Unit, Laboratory Accreditation Unit, and Training and Technical Support Unit. Its tasks and duties are as follows:
2. Developing and accurately drawing strategic plans for the college according to precise timings.
3. Guiding the departments and units in the college regarding the application of quality standards.
4. Disseminating the culture of quality among all members.
5. Preparing self-evaluation reports and sending them to the Quality Assurance and University Performance Department in the University Presidency.
6. Creating an updated database for faculty members, technicians, and the college's infrastructure.
7. Completing the performance evaluation of all faculty members, administrators, and technicians working in the college annually through coordination with the scientific departments and sending it to the Presidency of the University of Mosul / Quality Assurance and University Performance Department on the specified date each year.
8. Completing the annual performance evaluation of the college through coordination with the departments and units and sending it to the Presidency of the University of Mosul / Quality Assurance and University Performance Department on the specified date each year.
9. Updating the database of faculty members, administrators, and technicians working in the college and storing it in the system of the Ministry of Higher Education and Scientific Research.



Second : Section of Finances

The Financial Affairs Division consists of four units:

Accounts Unit, Higher Education Fund Unit, Equipment Unit, Financial Planning Unit.

The division's tasks and duties include:

1. Preparing monthly salary lists, which are audited by the Control and Auditing Department in the University Presidency, and then handed over to the Disbursement Division in the Financial Affairs Department for the purpose of disbursement.
2. Withdrawing advances from the University Presidency/Financial Affairs from the allocations allocated in the budget for the specified fiscal year.
3. The division collects revenues from graduating students.
4. Collecting wages from students of all stages at the beginning of each academic year.
5. Implementing financial disbursement operations related to the current budget accounts in coordination with the Internal Control and Audit Directorate.
6. Following up on financial financing operations for the current budget accounts with the Ministry of Finance.
7. Transferring disbursement and collection vouchers, recording and collection to the sub-registers and withdrawing their monthly analytical statements.
8. Extracting the trial balance and matching the bank statement and analytical statements monthly.
9. Following up on the liquidation of advances, debit balances, deposits and credit balances.
10. Extracting the final accounts and their analytical statements and submitting them to the concerned authorities.
11. Responding to the reports of the Financial Control Bureau in coordination with the concerned authorities.

Third: Post-graduate Studies Section

The Postgraduate Studies Division consists of three units: Admissions Unit, Student Affairs Follow-up Unit, and University Orders Unit.

The most important tasks and duties of this division:

1. Preparing plans for admission to postgraduate studies in various specializations.
2. Circulating the regulations for applying to postgraduate studies and its instructions approved by the Ministry to the scientific departments.
3. Preparing the admission system through all application channels, reviewing it and sending it to the Presidency of the University of Mosul/Postgraduate Studies Division.
4. Following up on students' direct admission and study leaves for employees.
5. Following up on student study extensions and exceptional extensions.
6. Issuing official letters to facilitate the task of postgraduate students to all parties related to student research.
7. Following up on the creation of postgraduate studies in various specializations according to the college's capabilities.

Fourth: Students Affairs and Registration Section

The Student Affairs and Registration Division consists of five units: Student Affairs Follow-up Unit, Graduates and Certifications Unit, Audit and Documents Unit, Registration and Admissions Unit, and Courses Unit. The most important tasks and duties of this division:

1. The first task is to receive students graduating from preparatory studies and undertake the tasks of registering them within the ranks of the college students in its various departments according to the rates allocated to each department.
2. Providing undergraduate students with books supporting their continuity in attendance.
3. Issuing graduation documents for students of both regular and grade types in addition to the mural certificate.
4. Calculating the sequences of graduating students at the college level.
5. Issuing IDs for all academic stages for bachelor's students.
6. Issuing a certificate of authenticity for documents issued by the college

Fifth: Scientific Affairs Section

The tasks and duties of this division are:

1. Issuing scientific leave orders for professors inside and outside Iraq.
2. Facilitating the tasks of professors or instructors in all universities, centers and ministries.
3. Following up on the curricula of undergraduate and graduate studies with their units and hours.
4. Submitting the scientific plan for the departments and the deanship.
5. Submitting the scientific structure for all scientific departments.
6. Responding to letters related to scientific affairs sent by the university such as writing and printing books and other similar matters.
7. Sending invitations to conferences, seminars and symposia related to scientific departments.

Sixth: Planning Section

The tasks and duties of this division:

1. Collecting data on the college's faculty and staff by receiving administrative orders from the Human Resources Division and sending them to the Presidency of the University of Mosul / Planning and Information.
2. Entering data into the computer and updating it.
3. Making quarterly statistics for all data through periodic monthly reports for members and updating them.
4. Providing departments and divisions with information according to what is required and available to the division.
5. Following up on the staff and auditing it with the Human Resources Division.
6. Collecting data on the college's facilities, including buildings, classrooms, laboratories, playgrounds and other supplies.
7. Preparing a database for students, including the academic stage, age, gender and nationality, as well as the number of students present and participating in exams for each year.

Seventh: Media Section

The tasks and duties of this division are:

1. Covering the college's activities from a media perspective and documenting them on the college's official website and approved social media sites.
2. It is a link between the college and the Media Department in the university presidency.
3. Supervising conferences, seminars and activities held by the college.
4. Supplying the Media Department in the university presidency with press reports and media activities related to the college.

Eighth: Papers Section

The tasks and duties of this division are:

1. Receiving mail from the presidency of the University of Mosul. And delivering it to the Dean of the College for review and marginalization, and then returning it to the division to enter it in the incoming register and distribute it to the scientific departments, units and administrative divisions in order to take the necessary action and respond to it.
2. Responding to incoming mail from the scientific departments, divisions and administrative units.
3. Collecting all printed books and sending them to the Dean of the College for the purpose of signing them and returning them to the division for the purpose of entering them in the outgoing register and distributing them according to copies to the scientific departments, divisions and administrative units.
4. Retaining copies of the issued books, collecting them, classifying them and storing them in special files according to the sequence, days, months and years to facilitate the process of referring to them as priorities.
5. Transferring these special files to the warehouses according to the years and sequence and keeping them in special cabinets for the purpose of referring to them when needed.

Ninth: Human Resources Section

The duties and responsibilities of this department are:

1. Issuing administrative orders for full-time faculty members, as well as orders for overtime work
2. Issuing administrative orders for full-time direct appointments of employees and lecturers and opening special files for them
3. Completing the transactions of employees and lecturers referred to retirement and sending them to the National Retirement Authority / Nineveh
4. Issuing orders for granting study leave to those accepted for postgraduate studies (master's) from employees, and issuing administrative orders for granting partial full-time leave to those accepted for doctorate from lecturers holding a master's degree inside Iraq.
5. Contacting the departments concerned with granting certificates of various types to verify the validity of the issuance of orders and documents related to the graduation of our college members.
6. Providing college members from employees and lecturers with letters of support when they need them for the relevant departments.
7. Conducting special transfer transactions for some of our college members to other departments.
8. Conducting transactions for members who deserve promotion and submitting them to the university presidency.
9. Issuing administrative orders for granting annual allowances to deserving college members.
10. Issuing disengagement orders for members sent outside Iraq and issuing orders for their commencement upon their return.
11. Issuing assignment orders for college members inside Iraq.
12. Keeping the books issued by the department in personal files and maintaining them.
13. Organizing housing forms for members wishing to live in university housing and forms for the purpose of obtaining residential land.
14. Conducting the required statistics for our college members when requested by the Ministry or the Presidency of Mosul University.

15. Maintaining the records of employees and lecturers and matching them with the presidency of the University of Mosul.
16. Conducting transactions for members applying for fellowships, missions and study leaves outside Iraq.
17. Organizing incentive forms for college members.
18. Organizing forms for confirming employees and lecturers after one year of starting their job and issuing administrative orders to do so if they are eligible.
19. Issuing letters of thanks and appreciation to college members who are eligible for this according to their activity.
20. Issuing administrative orders for forming committees in the college as well as ending the work of committees.
21. Promoting transactions for those wishing to be granted regular leave to travel outside Iraq with or without pay to the presidency of the university and issuing orders for separation in the event of obtaining the original approvals and orders for their commencement after their return.
22. Organizing the identity transaction for new members and changing the identities of those who obtained new academic titles and submitting them to the presidency of the university.
23. Editing and printing official letters by the members of the division as well as photographing the books belonging to the division.

Tenth: The Warehouse

Its tasks lie in the following points:

1. Entering the stored materials according to the purchase receipt in (entry vouchers) after being signed by the Dean of the College.
2. Exiting each material entering the warehouse according to a request submitted to the Dean or the Administrative Assistant (in the exit vouchers).
3. Submitting a request for warehouse needs and according to the needs of the units and departments to the Dean to discuss with the Purchasing Committee in the purchase.
4. Entering materials and devices imported from abroad or from local markets, and they are distributed to the scientific and administrative departments according to the warehouse entry and exit documents.
5. Forming annual inventory committees to match the warehouse balances at the end of each year.
6. Organizing the warehouses and disposing of surplus materials and idle devices and organizing lists to write them off and sell them according to the university's approval.

Eleventh: The Library and Free Education

Its tasks lie in the following points:

1. Providing sources and references to those who need them from students, faculty members and researchers according to specific return conditions according to the instructions of the library administration.
2. Providing theses and dissertations that are usually received from students who have obtained higher degrees (from inside and outside the college) to be available to their beneficiaries.
3. Providing periodicals specific to the college or those that come to the library from institutions, universities, ministries or affiliated centers.
4. Free education provides curriculum books for undergraduate students and follows up on their delivery, receipt and maintenance and indicates the number of distributed books and the future need of the departments in the college.

Twelfth: Legal Affairs Unit

Its tasks lie in the following points:

1. Authenticating guarantees, pledges, study contracts and other contracts related to the work of the department and higher education, and auditing those contracts that are within the jurisdiction of the Legal Affairs Department in the University Presidency
2. Representing the department in the investigative committees formed in the college.
3. Providing legal advice to the college departments and the deanship.
4. Presenting positions with the Human Resources Department regarding the status of martyrs, wounded and those affected by military operations, kidnappings and others.
5. Following up on lawsuits filed against or by the college with the aim of ensuring the rights of the college before the judiciary, and issuing warnings and notifications regarding them in coordination with the Legal Department in the University Presidency
6. Following up on daily mail related to the work of the department, responding to it and following up on it

Thirteenth: Internal Audit and Control Section

The division supervises and audits all the college's departments, as all its units are audited, including salaries, expense or revenue records, receipt and cash registers, matching them, following up on the implementation of the budget, monitoring stores, and submitting periodic reports.

Activities of the Control and Audit Division :

1. Conducting a documentary audit of all disbursement documents and ensuring that expenses are classified and that financial credit is available before disbursement.
2. Auditing the general journal register, the cash register, the advances and trusts register, auditing the final accounts, and the consolidation register.
3. Auditing the trial balance, matching it with the records and matching the bank statement with disbursements and deposits.
4. Periodically inventorying the funds and ensuring the accuracy of receipts, disbursements, and deposits, as well as cash holdings.
5. Auditing salary lists and records, following up on deductions, following up on advances granted to committees, and auditing additional lectures for faculty members.
6. Preparing a detailed monthly report for the Dean and providing directions and observations on the progress of the college's activities.
7. Auditing the Human Resources Division.
8. Auditing the personal files of employees and professors.

9. Auditing the incoming and outgoing unit and auditing its records.
10. Following up on issued administrative orders and instructions.
11. Making a visit to the college store and ensuring the provision of safety and good storage means for incoming materials.
12. Making a monthly and quarterly inventory as well as making a surprise inventory of materials.
13. Auditing records and documents for direct entry and disbursement.
14. Matching the inventory with the entry records and matching the transfer.
15. Making visits to all college departments to follow up on their work and audit the records.

Fourteenth: Administrative Affairs

1. Organizing car entry badge transactions for all members
2. Organizing central transportation ID transactions for college members.
3. Organizing attendance and departure records for college employees.
4. Following up on special projects in the college, including construction, restoration and painting.
5. Following up on contractors of kiosks and photocopying offices in the college.
6. Following up on tenders and public auctions in the college.
7. Ensuring the college's general safety requirements.
8. Following up on services and maintenance related to college cleanliness, electrical installations, blacksmithing, water pipes, carpentry, etc.
9. Following up on all work carried out by technicians and engineers from the Services and Maintenance Division in the University Presidency.
10. Maintaining fire extinguishing tools, equipment and their readiness.
11. Nominating some college members for civil defense courses.

Fifteenth: Council Resolution Section

Tasks of the Council's Rapporteurs Division:

1. Editing the College Council minutes, following up on related issues and obtaining their approval.
2. Editing the department minutes and issuing their approval.
3. Following up on College Council letters and responding to them.
4. Receiving the University Council minutes and following up on related issues that concern our college.
5. Keeping the ministry minutes after reviewing them by the Dean

Sixteenth: Scientific Promotions Section

Tasks of the Scientific Promotions and Support Division:

1. Completing promotions for faculty members in our college at various academic ranks.
2. Promoting requests to add research to promotion transactions for faculty members in scientific and humanities departments
3. Promoting promotion transactions for faculty members
4. Promoting promotion transactions from outside the University of Mosul in various specializations.
5. Auditing a number of scientific promotion transactions at various ranks received from the Central Committee for Scientific Promotions.
6. Supporting research for scientific and humanities departments
7. Providing the Central Committee for Scientific Promotions with the movement of promotions
8. Circulating official letters received from the Central Committee for Scientific Promotions to all departments and following up on them.

Seventeenth: Continuing Education

The Concept of Continuing Learning

Continuing education contributes to finding the appropriate potentials and ways to keep pace with the rapid cognitive and technological development, in order to serve the community, and take it to the ranks of advanced societies.

Continuing Education Unit:

It is one of the administrative units affiliated with the College of Education for Humanities - University of Mosul, which is concerned with supporting scientific activities and events that instructors and researchers wish to carry out, such as seminars, courses and workshops.

The most important objectives and tasks of the unit:

1. Training academic and research staff at all levels, developing their skills, and raising their efficiency.
2. Keeping pace with research developments at the theoretical and applied levels.
3. Communicating and exchanging experiences between the university's academic institutions and educational institutions in the local community.
4. Preparing the annual plan for the college's activities represented by (conferences, seminars, courses, workshops, seminars, and guidance programs).
5. Preparing data on each course, seminar or conference in terms of title, number of participants and a summary of the topic, and sending it to the university.
6. Providing certificates of appreciation to participants in courses and conferences.

Eighteenth: Online Education Unit

One of the administrative units affiliated with the College of Education for Humanities - University of Mosul. It is one of the newly established units concerned with supporting e-learning activities and teaching using modern technologies.

The most important goals and tasks of the unit:

1. Supports the educational role of the college by adding the technological dimension to regular education within the framework of supporting the skills of faculty members to produce modern electronic lectures on the international network
2. Providing advice to faculty members on producing their lectures into electronic lectures.
3. Providing courses and workshops for faculty members.
4. Promoting and encouraging excellence in the fields of teaching and digital education as academic activities.
5. Raising the efficiency of students in developing themselves through self-learning via curricula and lectures spread on the Internet.
6. Increasing student interaction with in-person lectures to use digital means so that the instructor can obtain feedback from students.

Nineteenth: Missions and Cultural Relations Unit

The Missions and Cultural Relations Unit was established in the College of Education for Humanities in 2022. It is one of the main departments of the college. This unit is managed by employees affiliated with the college and a director from among the teaching staff of the College of Education for Humanities/Department of English. This unit is responsible for the affairs of students and faculty members of the College of Education for Humanities studying abroad and those sent from and to local and foreign universities, as well as organizing cultural relations and scientific activities inside and outside the college in order to advance and improve the reality of education in the College of Education for Humanities.

Department Objectives:

The main goal of the Missions and Cultural Relations Unit is to advance the reality of education for the College of Education and then advance the high level of quality and efficiency for the university and society and bridge the gap that separates it from the countries of the developed world through the tasks provided by this unit.

Tasks and Duties of the Unit:

1. Taking care of the affairs of students who have missions, fellowships or study leaves by facilitating what they seek.
2. Organizing cultural and scientific relations inside and outside the college specialized in all fields with the aim of achieving the maximum benefit from all scientific, research and study activities offered and delivering them to all departments of the college.

Twenty: Reconstruction and Projects Unit

The **Reconstruction and Projects Unit** is one of the vital units within the College, playing a key role in the implementation of reconstruction and urban development projects, in accordance with approved technical and engineering standards. The unit aims to complete these projects with the highest levels of quality and in the shortest possible time, in alignment with the educational, academic, and research needs of the College. The unit is also responsible for the renovation and maintenance of existing and older buildings, with the goal of upgrading their infrastructure to meet the standards adopted by reputable academic institutions. Special attention is given to effective project management, promoting competitiveness in execution in terms of both quality and quantity, which contributes to achieving optimal results and providing advanced infrastructure that supports the College's strategic objectives.

Accordingly, the **Reconstruction and Projects Unit** is considered one of the most important units within the organizational structure of the Ministry of Higher Education and Scientific Research, due to its central role in supporting the development process and advancing the educational and infrastructural standards of the institution.

Twenty one: Career Development Unit

Main Objectives of the Unit:

Designing and implementing training programs and workshops for students and graduates of the college and university, in line with labor market needs.

Establishing communication channels with public and private sector institutions to facilitate access to available training and employment opportunities for students and graduates.

Coordinating and preparing for job fairs in cooperation with private and government companies to enable students and graduates to engage directly with potential employers.

Organizing workshops and training courses to develop specialized professional skills, e-management skills, decision-making abilities, and leadership capacities for students and graduates.

Providing career counseling services to students and creating a comprehensive database for graduates and employers.

Organizing employment fairs and professional networking events.

Tracking graduates and analyzing their employment outcomes.

Implementing the National Strategy for Education and Higher Education (2021–2031) according to the themes established by the Ministry for Career Development, Employment, and Follow-up Divisions at university centers, in cooperation with the relevant units in the colleges.

Twenty Two: Scientific Affairs Unit

Responsibilities of the Scientific Affairs Unit:

Preparing the organizational structure and scientific plans for academic departments and the college administration.

Monitoring and following up on the curricula of undergraduate and postgraduate studies, including their modules and credit hours.

Facilitating the tasks of faculty members and lecturers across universities, research centers, and various ministries.

Issuing orders for academic sabbaticals (scientific leave) for faculty members both inside Iraq and abroad.

Responding to official correspondence related to scientific affairs, such as book authorship, publication requests, and other academic matters sent by universities.

Sending out invitations for conferences, seminars, and workshops organized by the academic departments.

Twenty Three: Confidential Correspondence

Responsibilities Related to Confidential Correspondence:

Receiving confidential letters from the University Presidency after being annotated by the Dean, recording them in the confidential incoming registry, delivering them to the relevant department with a receipt record, and keeping a copy in the confidential incoming files.

Receiving confidential letters from all state institutions after being annotated by the Dean, recording them in the confidential incoming registry, delivering them to the concerned department with a receipt record, and archiving a copy in the confidential incoming files.

Registering all confidential outgoing correspondence issued by any division or unit within the College—including those issued by the Dean's Office—in the confidential outgoing registry and keeping a copy in the confidential outgoing files.

Typing all confidential correspondence related to the Dean's Office, issuing them formally, and keeping a copy in the confidential outgoing files of the Dean's Office, with proper follow-up procedures.

Digitally archiving all confidential incoming and outgoing correspondence to ensure easy access and preservation, in addition to maintaining paper copies.

About the Department:

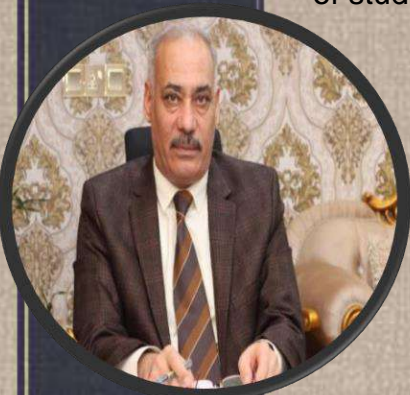
In its beginning, the current English Language Department was a branch within the Languages Department, which was established in the academic year 1974/1975, which also included the Arabic Language Department. The English Language Department became a separate department in the academic year 1978/1979 after the number of accepted students from middle school graduates increased. The academically qualified teachers are prepared to undertake the tasks of teaching English in middle and high schools. The first batch graduated in the academic year 1978/1979. The academic system adopted in the department is the annual system. Academic guide for the Department of Geography

About the Department

The Department of Geography is a branch of the humanities in its goal and a branch of the scientific branches in its content, as it combines several sciences that adopt scientific and applied aspects as a method of study and a starting point for academic scientific research. Its main goal is to address the issues that unite the relationship between man and the surface of the earth in service of its evolving reality. The Department of Geography was established in the College of Education at our prestigious university in 1975 under the name of the Department of Social Sciences and included the branches of history and geography, then the Department of Geography became independent from the Department of History in 1982. Evening studies were established in the department in 2007/2008. The department seeks to develop the scientific and educational capabilities of students to provide the education directorates with specialized teachers, scientific researchers and postgraduate students in all universities of the country. The department has been a pioneer in establishing postgraduate studies (master's) since 1985/1986, doctoral studies since 1990/1991, and higher diploma studies in cartography and geographic information systems since 2003/2004. The department has adopted a specialized scientific methodology in applied academic studies and research and supervising postgraduate students (master's and doctoral) in geography specializations within the branches of physical geography and human geography, and specializing in geography teaching methods since 2019/2020. It has a role in providing state service institutions (Directorate of Urban Planning, Directorate of Municipalities, Directorate of Municipalities, Directorate of Agriculture, Directorate of Roads and Bridges, etc.) with specialists in cartography and geographic information systems who have obtained a higher diploma in it. The study in the department is for four years, during which the graduate is awarded a bachelor's degree in geography, in addition to postgraduate studies that the graduate is allowed to apply for in the same department or in similar geographic departments of other colleges of education, as they include: studying for a higher diploma in cartography and geographic information systems, which allows graduates of some departments with spatial studies of geographic fields in some purely scientific colleges to study in, studying for a master's degree in physical geography, human geography, and teaching methods, and currently also in cartography and geographic information systems, and studying for a doctorate, which has currently been closed due to the shortage in the number of holders of academic titles of professor and assistant professor among the faculty members in the department, due to most of them reaching retirement age, which they were referred to during the past years.
