# Guide for Describing the Academic Program and Course

#### **Introduction:**

The educational program is considered a coordinated and organized package of courses that include procedures and experiences designed to systematically cover specific curriculum content. The primary purpose is to build and refine the skills of graduates, making them qualified to meet the demands of the job market. The program is reviewed and evaluated annually through internal or external auditing procedures and programs, such as the external examiner program .

The description of the academic program provides a concise summary of the main features of the program and its courses, highlighting the skills that students are intended to acquire, based on the objectives of the academic program. This description is essential as it serves as the cornerstone for obtaining program accreditation. It is written by teaching staff under the supervision of scientific committees in the academic departments .

This guide, in its second edition, includes an updated description of the academic program, following the revision of the previous guide's contents in light of developments in the educational system in Iraq. The updated description covers the traditional academic program structure (annual, semester-based systems), in addition to the adoption of the academic program description generalized by the Book of the Studies Department T M3/2906 on 3/5/2023, concerning programs based on the Bologna Process .

In this context, we emphasize the importance of drafting academic program and course descriptions to ensure the smooth operation of the educational process .

#### **Course Description:**

The course description offers a concise summary of the main features of the course and the expected learning outcomes for students, demonstrating whether the student has made the most of the available learning opportunities. It is derived from the academic program description .

#### **Program Vision:**

An ambitious vision for the future of the academic program, aiming to be advanced, inspiring, motivating, realistic, and feasible.

#### **Program Mission:**

It briefly outlines the objectives and the activities necessary to achieve them, also defining the program's development paths and directions .

#### **Program Objectives:**

These are statements describing what the academic program intends to achieve over a specific period, which must be measurable and observable .

#### **Curriculum Structure:**

It includes all the courses or subjects within the academic program, according to the adopted learning system (semester-based, annual, Bologna Process), whether they are required (by the Ministry, university, College, or scientific department), along with the number of study units.

#### **Learning Outcomes:**

A set of aligned knowledge, skills, and values acquired by the student after successfully completing the academic program. The learning outcomes for each course should be defined in a way that aligns with the program's objectives .

#### **Teaching and Learning Strategies:**

These are strategies employed by College members to develop student teaching and learning. They are plans followed to achieve learning objectives, describing all classroom and extracurricular activities designed to achieve the program's learning outcomes .
