### About the Department:

The Department of Tourism Studies is one of the promising departments within the College of Tourism Sciences at the University of Mosul. Established in 2018, it was founded to meet the labor market's need for qualified personnel in the tourism sector. The department graduated its first cohort of students in the 2022 academic year.

It adopts an academic vision grounded in an integrative approach that combines theoretical knowledge with practical application. The focus is on preparing students with advanced tourism awareness and analytical and managerial skills that enable them to compete in the job market.

The curriculum is built on a multidisciplinary approach that integrates tourism planning, marketing, business management, and sustainable tourism. It emphasizes equipping students with scientific research tools and leveraging digital transformation to enhance tourism services.

The department is also committed to strengthening students' academic and scientific capabilities, qualifying them for careers in the tourism sector or for pursuing postgraduate studies. This contributes to community service and deepens the understanding of tourism as an economic, cultural, and social dimension.

Founded in 2018 at our prestigious university's College of Tourism Sciences, the department graduated its first class in 2022. It has taken the lead in authoring and publishing the first specialized book on tourism geography among peer colleges of tourism sciences in Iraqi universities.

The department follows a specialized academic methodology in teaching and applied academic research. Faculty members supervise undergraduate graduation projects for fourth-year students and play a role in supplying state service institutions—such as the Ministry of Culture, Tourism and Antiquities, the Tourism Board, and tourist resorts—with skilled professionals.

The program spans four years, at the end of which graduates earn a Bachelor's degree in Tourism Studies.

- 8 Build strategic partnerships with tourism entities to achieve common





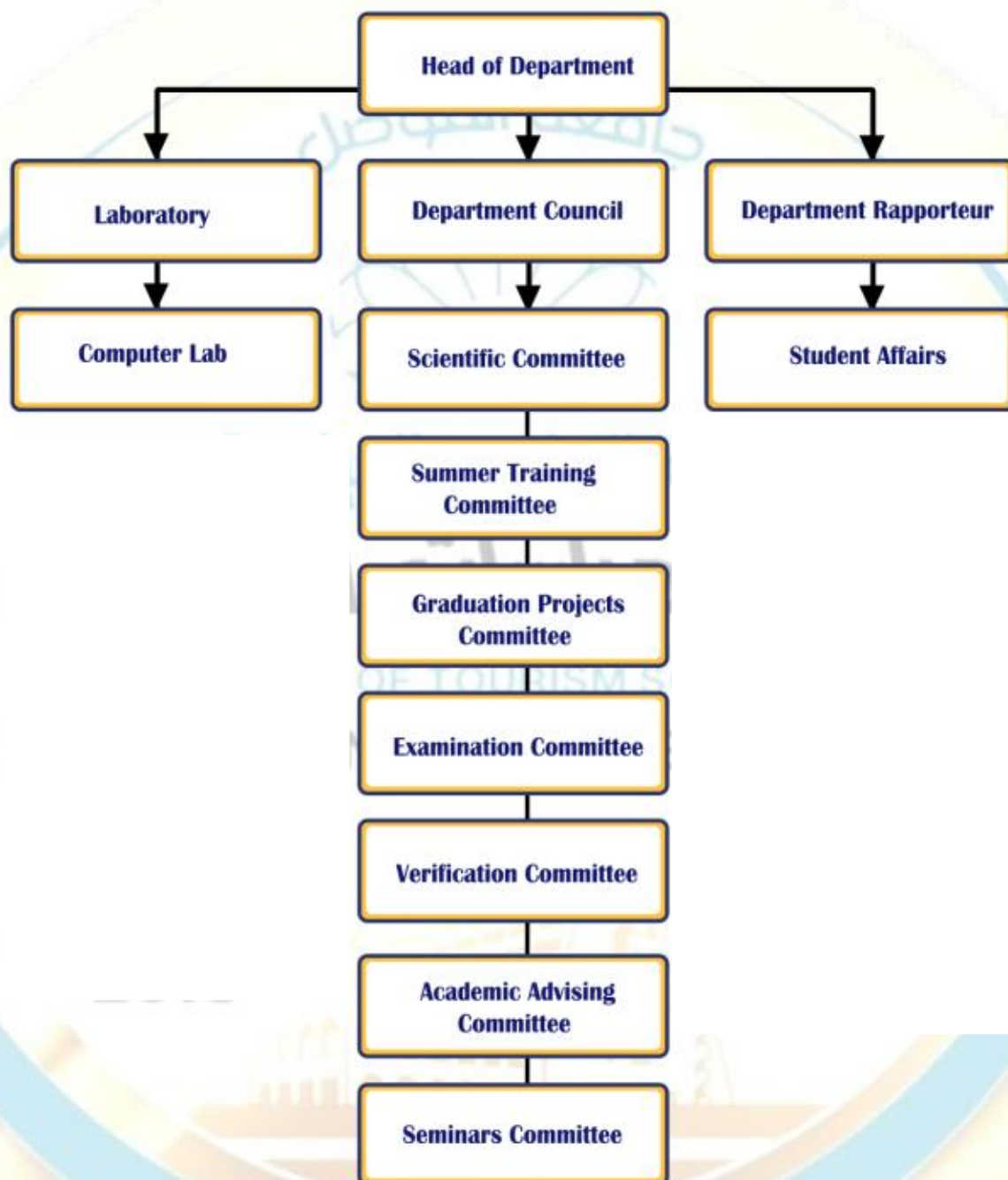


**he geographical location of the department and the college

## The Administrative Board of the Department





## Task Description

- **Head of Department Responsibilities**

The head of the department is primarily responsible for managing the department and organizing its academic, administrative, and financial affairs. Their tasks include preparing and monitoring the implementation of the department's strategic plan, overseeing academic and research activities, and ensuring students' regular attendance and participation in examinations. They are also responsible for developing internal and external relationships for the department, securing its educational, research, administrative, and financial requirements, with a focus on enhancing performance quality and improving academic outcomes. Additionally, they oversee the periodic review of curricula, propose updates to the college council, ensure faculty members' commitment to their academic duties, and supervise the distribution of academic schedules. They also hold regular meetings with students to listen to their suggestions and address their issues, working to resolve any obstacles they face.

- **Department Coordinator Responsibilities**

The department coordinator is tasked with monitoring the department's daily operations, organizing documents and records, and tracking student absences. They are responsible for preparing schedules for classes and examinations in coordination with the teaching staff, ensuring the smooth operation of the educational process.

- **Department Council**

The department council serves as an advisory body that contributes to shaping internal policies and monitoring the implementation of academic plans. It works in coordination with the head of the department to ensure the integration of academic and administrative activities. The council also supports the academic staff and works to improve educational programs in alignment with quality standards.

- **Scientific Committee**

The scientific committee is one of the department's key permanent







committees, formed by a decision of the department council in accordance with the instructions of the Ministry of Higher Education and Scientific Research. This committee oversees scientific and specialized matters related to academic courses, educational plans, curriculum development, and the approval of textbooks and supplementary materials. It also monitors academic performance evaluation procedures, course distribution, and the review of course content to align with market demands and developments.

- **Examination Committee**

The examination committee undertakes precise tasks related to organizing and monitoring examinations at all stages, from preparing invigilation schedules and distributing staff duties to receiving exam questions and organizing results while ensuring their confidentiality. The committee also analyzes results, extracts statistical indicators related to pass and fail rates, and oversees supplementary (second-round) examinations according to strict regulations.

- **Audit Committee**

The audit committee works in parallel with the examination committee during the examination period, reviewing grades submitted by faculty, whether for coursework or final exams, to ensure their accuracy before official announcement. This committee is a cornerstone in ensuring integrity and precision in results.

- **Graduation Research Projects Committee**

This committee is responsible for organizing the preparation and discussion of graduation projects, starting with collecting research proposals from faculty, organizing their distribution to students based on specific criteria, continuously monitoring project progress, and concluding with forming discussion panels and documenting results.

- **Academic Advising Committee**

The academic advising committee aims to provide academic support to students through individual and group advisory meetings. It listens to the academic and educational challenges students face and prepares detailed reports submitted to the department administration to help find appropriate solutions.





### Laboratory and Classrooms

The classrooms are equipped to meet the requirements of modern educational processes, featuring an organized seating arrangement and comfortable natural lighting. They are also furnished with air-conditioning systems and modern display devices (Projectors) to support both theoretical and interactive learning. The department administration strives to provide a stimulating and conducive learning environment that enhances the efficiency of education.

As for the computer laboratory, it has been established according to the standards approved by the Ministry of Higher Education and Scientific Research. It includes modern computers and advanced software programs. These laboratories are used to apply the practical aspects of academic courses, particularly in the fields of computing, electronic management, and scientific research. Additionally, they are equipped with smart display screens (Smart Screens) to promote interactive learning during lectures.

- **Summer Training Committee**

The summer training committee is responsible for nominating and facilitating the training of third-year students in public institutions by issuing official correspondence, monitoring students' performance during the training period, and receiving final reports. This enhances students' practical experience and complements the theoretical knowledge gained in classrooms.

- **Seminars Committee**

The seminars committee in the Hotel Studies Department is responsible for reviewing and discussing scientific research submitted by faculty members to ensure alignment with the department's objectives and scientific plans. This contributes to the development of the educational process and keeps pace with the needs of the tourism market.
