Types Of Nouns And Definitions And Examples

Types	Definitions	Examples
Common Noun	A noun that refers to a general person, place, thing, or idea.	book, city, dog, happiness
Proper Noun	A noun that refers to a specific person, place, or thing and is always capitalized.	John, London, Eiffel Tower
Collective Noun	A noun that refers to a group of people, animals, or things as a single entity.	family, team, herd
Abstract Noun	A noun that refers to a concept or idea that cannot be physically seen or touched.	love, peace, justice
Concrete Noun	A noun that refers to something that can be physically seen, touched, or measured.	tree, house, rock
Countable Noun	A noun that can be counted and has both a singular and plural form.	apple, chair, dog(s)
Uncountable Noun	A noun that cannot be counted and does not have a plural form.	water, sugar, furniture
Compound Noun	A noun that is made up of two or more words.	toothbrush, basketball, blackboard

Proper Nouns: Example Sentences:

He lives in **London**.



Marry is a beautiful girl.

Abstract Nouns: Example Sentences:

Honesty is important in **Love**.

He is my **happiness**.

I am a **trusted** Person.

Concrete Nouns: Example Sentences:

The **dog** is playing.

This is a small **table**.

Baby is eating an **apple**.

Collective Nouns: Example Sentences:

The **team** celebrated their victory.

My **family** members are 10.

Compound Nouns: Example Sentences:

I don't use **toothpaste** with the brush.

Yesterday I went to the **swimming pool**.

She cleaned her **Bedroom**.

Countable Nouns: Example Sentences:

I am sitting on the **chair**.

He bought three **books**.

He is eating an **apple**.

Uncountable Nouns: Example Sentences:

She drank some **water**.



I ate **rice** for lunch.
