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
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Summary:

Combining Vowel:

A combining vowel sometimes is used to make the medical term easier to pronounce. **O** is the most commonly used combining vowel.



- The combining vowel is used before suffix.
- The combining vowel is used when the **suffix** begins with a **consonant** and not used when the suffix begins with a vowel, examples:
- 1- The root- Arthr: means joint. The suffix -scope is an instrument used for examination.
 - Arthroscope.
 - Gastroenteritis. Gastr=stomach o enteritis=inflammation of intestine
 - Neuroplasty.
 Osteoporosis
 Neur=nerve o plasty=repair
 o porosis= weak
 - Myocardial My=muscle o cardial

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2- The suffix -itis. A **Gastritis** is inflammation of the stomach, because the suffix -itis beginning with a vowel, the combining vowel **is not used.**

Another example: Neur and suffix: itis = neuritis

Types of Suffixes:

Many suffixes can be grouped together by meaning or by the category they modify. Initially, when learning suffixes, it is easiest if the learner groups them by meaning or category.
