Present Simple Tense

What Is the Present Simple?

The **Present Simple** is a tense used to describe:

- Regular or habitual actions
- Facts or general truths
- Scheduled events (often in the near future)
- Instructions or directions

Structure

Affirmative Sentences

Subject + base verb (+ s/es for he, she, it)

Subject	Verb	Example
I/You/We/They	play	We play football every weekend.
He/She/It	plays	She plays the piano.

Negative Sentences

Subject + do/does not + base verb

Subject	Auxiliary	Example
I/You/We/They	do not (don't)	They don't watch TV.
He/She/It	does not (doesn't)	He doesn't like coffee.

When to Use the Present Simple

1. Habits and Routines

- I wake up at 7 a.m. every day.
- He drinks coffee in the morning.

2. General Truths and Facts

- Water boils at 100°C.
- The Earth orbits the sun.

3. Scheduled Events (e.g. timetables)

- The train leaves at 9 p.m.
- School starts in September.

4. Instructions and Directions

- You turn left at the traffic light.
- First, mix the flour with sugar.

Time Expressions Commonly Used

- every day/week/year
- always, usually, often, sometimes, rarely, never
- on Mondays, in the morning, at night
- once/twice a week

Example: She usually walks to school.
